Resolution #2017-72 - Terminating Employement of the Business Administrator

Councilman Bunce made a motion to adopt a resolution terminating the employment of the Business Administrator for the Borough of Hopatcong. Seconded by Councilman Padula.

WHEREAS, the current Business Administrator serves pursuant to an appointment of the governing body and an employment agreement dated on or about November 23, 2016;

WHEREAS, the procedure for terminating the Business Administrator is set forth in N.J.S.A. 40A:9-138;

WHEREAS, the Business Administrator's employment agreement references N.J.S.A. 40A:9-138 in Section 7 relating to Termination;

WHEREAS, Borough Ordinance 33-2D(2) provides a slightly different procedure for termination;

WHEREAS, in any contradiction between state statute and borough ordinance, the state statute supersedes a borough ordinance;

WHEREAS, the Borough Council desires to terminate the Borough Administrator's contract without delay so an appropriate search can begin for a replacement;

WHEREAS, the Borough Council will allow for a period of reconsideration to address the due process provided for in the Borough Ordinance;

NOW THEREFORE IT BE RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Hopatcong that the Business Administrator's contract is hereby terminated effective immediately and the Business Administrator is immediately relieved of his duties;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution will serve as the preliminary resolution as set forth in Borough Ordinance 33-2D(2) and the Business Administrator shall have 5 days to may file a statement of reconsideration;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, if no written request is received from the Business Administrator, this resolution of termination will become final without further action:

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Business Administrator will remain on the payroll pursuant to the severance payment requirements of N.J.S.A. 40A:9-138; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a resolution shall be prepared by the Borough Attorney and the CFO setting forth all amounts due to the Business Administrator under the statute and the Employment Agreement and presented to the Council for approval within 30 days.
